GOVERNOR AND BIG Delegations to help Install Rotarians

At the installation meeting of the Rotary Club, of Annapolis, to be held tonight at Carvel Hall, nearly 200 outof-town Rotarians are expected to be present, and the event is being looked forward to as an epochal one in Aunapolis. At this Charter meeting only members of the Club are eligible to attend, and among them will be Governor Ritchie, who is an honorary member.

Most of the delegates who will attend the meeting will come from the Baltimore and Washington Rotary Clubs, but other clubs of Maryland and Pennsylvania will also be represented. Among these other citles are Frederick, Hagerstown and Salisbury. Md., and York, Pa.

The regular meeting of the Rotary Club of Annapolis was held last night, and the members, whose names will appear on the charter that is to be delivered this evening, discussed tonight's function. Douglas Burnett, of the Baltimore Rotary Club, will preside at tonight's meeting, which will follow an elaborate dinner in the main dining room of Carvel Hall.

GOAL of the Rotary Club of Annapolis Foundation Inc. to reach a value of \$1,000,000 was achieved to honor the Club's Centennial.

61 Rotarians have contributed to the Foundation since 2015 when the 2021 Club was formed. 12 Rotarians are members of the 2021 Club and 4 Rotarians are making continuous pledges. Rotarians have contributed \$105,000 to the Foundation during the past 6 years.

The value of the Foundation, as of 1/31/2021, was \$1,150,000.00
